I'll be playing music of **Schumann** (his gentle *Arabesque*), **Bach** (the intense, elaborate No. 6 in E Minor), **Bartók** (the lively Suite, Op. 14), and **Chopin** (the *Andante spianato Grande Polonaise Brillante*, a virtuosic showpiece). This is an opportunity to hear four accessible classical masterpieces played on a fine concert grand in an acoustically exchall.

The public is also invited to my talk and preview performance, introducing the program, of Thursday, October 5th, and 3:30 PM, at the UVM Recital Hall.

In addition, I'll be featured on **Vermont Public, 90.9** in a live radio performance at **11**: **AM, on Thursday morning, October 5**th with host, Walter Parker.

A personal note: When I moved to Vermont with my family in 1996, I was still on the piant of the Interlochen Arts Academy. My impossible commute (Burlington to Traverse City, Mi ended the following year, and it was in 1998 that I started teaching piano at UVM, as a replacement for Liz Metcalfe. I also joined the MTNA and started, for the first time, teaching private students at home. Each year since then, I've performed at least one concert at UV wonderful opportunity that has been one of the most important experiences of my life. He 25 years later, making this recital seem particularly significant! I hope you'll come and sha experience with me.
